#### **Lesson Plan**

**Grade Level:** K-5 Grade

Subject Area: Social Emotional Learning (SEL) & Cross-Cultural Understanding

Hours of Instruction: 1 class hour

# **Learning Objectives**

By the end of this lesson, students will:

- Develop empathy and understanding for English learners and students from different cultural backgrounds.
- Identify and express supportive behaviors that contribute to a positive classroom environment.
- Practice standing up for classmates in appropriate and respectful ways.
- Gain awareness and appreciation of Korean culture, especially traditional foods like kimchi, and how cultural differences enrich the classroom.

### **Lesson Procedures**

## Introduction (15 minutes)

- Begin with a short discussion on the word "empathy" and what it means to show kindness and understanding to others, especially when they come from different backgrounds.
- Read aloud the story "Kimchi" from Kyongha Seager's book, focusing on the
  experiences of a Korean student facing bullying due to the smell of his favorite food,
  kimchi Fried Rice, his culture, and limited English.

### **Group Discussion (10 minutes)**

After reading, have students share their thoughts and emotions about the story. Encourage them to discuss what it might feel like to be new in a country and to no be different.

Ask guiding questions such as:

- "Why do you think Chiwon stopped eating his favorite Kimchi Fried Rice when Angela and Joey said it stinks?" P. 9(At the lunch cafeteria)
- "Why did McKenzie say to Joey and Angela for Chiwon?" P. 12,13
- Have you had an experience that hurt your feelings because of cultural differences, such as food, clothes, etc.?

 Have you ever had an experience you had a hard time since you had a language barrier?

## **Activity: Role-Playing Scenario (15 minutes)**

- Assign students different roles: Chiwon, Angela, Joey, and Mckenzie
- Or Assign students different roles: new student, bystander, and classmate who stands up for the new student.
- Role-play how to respectfully stand up for a friend, allowing students to practice speaking up and expressing empathy.

## Closing (5 minutes)

- Review how empathy and standing up for others can make everyone feel included and respected.
- If you were one of the characters Chiwon, Angela, Joey, and McKenzie in the story, who would you want to be and why?
